Step 1

Have the key switch turned to the platform controls and both E-stops pulled out. Allow the unit a few moments to go through start up initialization mode. Observe the platform control box



Step 2

Ensure that the LED viewing window is showing the battery charge indicator bars. These should come on a moment after turning the key to the platform controls.

Step 3

Depress and hold the left steer rocker switch for 10 seconds. At that point the last stored fault code will be displayed.

Step 4

Release the left steer rocker switch. Scroll through and view the last ten stored faults by repeatedly depressing the left steer rocker switch.

Step 5

While in this display mode, depressing the horn key erases all saved fault codes.

Step 6

To get out of fault viewing mode, depress the enable switch on the joystick.
